WANTED FOR MUSEUM

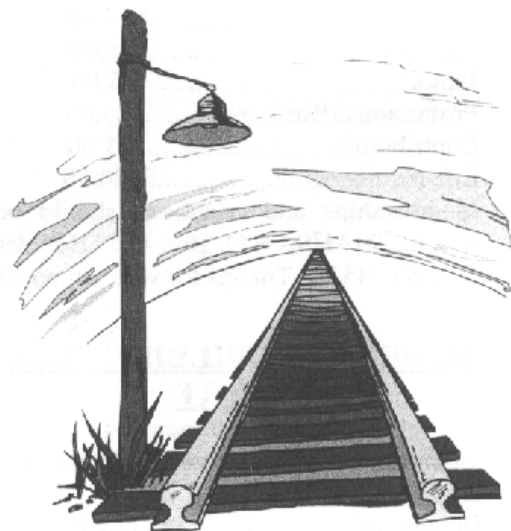
- Pictures of Guides with fish catches for display

**BOULDER BUS SERVICE
STARTED MAY 1929**

Thanks to Elmer we have a date for the start of bus service to Boulder Junction. This bus would eventually replace all train service to Boulder in the fall of 1932. In an article dated 5/17/29 in the **Minocqua Times**, *The Land o' Lakes Bus line of Wausau has started regular Bus service to the Trout lake territory for the summer season.... For the present connections will be made with the regular passenger train leaving Minocqua daily at 11:40 ... (arriving in) Boulder Junction at 1:10.... On or after June 3rd the schedule will be changed to conform with the fish train schedule.*
